Boffer games are played by people of all ages using foam padded boffer gear that is designed to safely come into contact with a player in order to resemble medieval swordplay. Boffer gear is constructed to resemble swords, shields, arrows, etc. All of the gear is built according to a large list of strict safety specifications provided by one of the leading national boffer organizations in the world called Belegarth (www.belegarth.com).


Low-contact rules are used for kids under

15. The players are encouraged by the referee and teamates to merely tap each other and to be appropriately gentle when swinging, depending on who they are playing with.

What do Ninjas and Circus artists have in common? They're both agile, adept, and just plain awesome! Learn to be more agile, adept, move like a cat and do amazing tricks in Circus Ninja Training.

Activities will culminate in awesome new skills and awareness including:

- martial arts (TaiJi, KungFu and Capoeira) inspired warmups, stretches and movement foundations for juggling
- inversions (hand stands and more!)
- partner acrobatics of lifts, balances and counterbalances inspired by acroyoga, dance and circus performance
- rolling and tumbling (safe falling), movement and acrobatic safety

We'll also do some one or two time special focus classes on:

- slack-lining
- human pyramids
- flow arts
- hooping

CJ O'Reilly is a Clan Destiny Circus member and has performed at LEAF and beyond! He is a Contact Improvisation instructor, AcroYoga Ninja, and has years of martial arts experience including Karate, Tae Kwon Do, and Chen and Yang Style Taiji with teachers in China. To him, circus is some serious play! CJ's favorite animal is the Tiger because they're the cutest as a cub, but intense and powerful as adults - RaaaaAArr~!~!~

Acro Ninja Cassidy Walpole is trained in Restorative Yoga and Thai Yoga Massage. She is a Certified AcroYoga Montreal Instructor, founder of Art of Acro, and teaches classes and workshops in WNC. Cassidy says, "Acroyoga is basically juggling with your feet, but instead of juggling balls, you are using an entire person! Flying is my favorite because, with the help of my partner, I get to float and fly and defy gravity!" Cassidy's favorite animal is the Koala, because they look sooo snuggly!

Winter is the time to go within and connect with our creativity, a time to cozy in with friends and share our dreams and visions. The Winter Roots circle for RCS girls will be an opportunity to connect with the spirit of winter through crafting, ritual, sharing and fire.

Week 1 & 2 - Spirit of Fire

We will learn how to honor fire and make fire by friction, as our ancestors have for thousands of years before us.

Week 3 & 4 - Magic of Cacao and Chocolate Making



I studied in a Zapotec Village in Mexico how to make cacao, toasting the beans over the fire and grinding them into a paste with a stone. I am honored to bring this ancient chocolate making technique to the



Winter Roots Circle. We will redefine what you think of as chocolate as we focus on the main ingredient: cacao. Many native peoples revered it as a sacred medicine, only to be used in ceremony. In this class we will use ceremonial grade cacao from Guatemala

to make sugar and dairy free delicious chocolate treats and beverages. We will experiment with a variety of superfood ingredients including some locally wildcrafted herbs using cacao as a base. Most importantly, we will come away with more love and respect for our plant ally cacao and a knowledge of how to respectfully call on her for healing.

Week 5, 6 & 7 - <u>Handmade Leather Bound Journals</u> We will sew and learn to make leather-bound Dream Journals.

Week 8 - Closing Fire

Sharing our Dreams & Visions, Making hot chocolate over the fire!

Dungeons & Dragons is filled with adventure, excitement, heroics, glory and more. It is one of the biggest RPGs out there and by far the most well-known. The thing is, most people don't know what a role playing game is. A role playing game is a chance to take on the role of a character in a wonderful and magical world. You decide upon a type of character to play (sneaky, magical, strong, etc.) and the role he/she will play in the group. For example, a cleric (which is a type of wizard) could heal the rest of the group if they get hurt and the strong character could fend off enemies from the rest of the group if they get in a dangerous situation. The group will then go on quests of varying difficulty

and motivation, complete tasks on the way, and collect great rewards for heroic deeds!



Edezra Cunningham is a 7th grade student who has been playing these games for years, and enjoys creating them as well as playing them. Now, he and the other leaders are telling a story of adventure and excitement in The Legend Of The Edge, a unique setting and journey designed by the leaders of the group: Willow Eshan, a classmate and friend who leads a lot of talk games at recess and after school, and Justin Pilla, the assistant teacher for 6th grade who has played a lot of D&D in the past and is a good friend of both students.


